In 1990 a group of Philadelphia area imams and other community stakeholders started the Majlis Ash-Shura of the Delaware Valley, to perform the prophetic sunnah of *shura* (consultation). It's organized as an independent 501 (c)(3) non-profit in the state of Pennsylvania. '*Majlis Ash-Shura*' can be translated to mean the consultative body, council, or meeting. Aside from being a consultative body, the Majlis attempts to facilitate Muslims fulfilling their obligations and share best practices for the area's Masjids. From sighting every lunar month beginning to intervening in conflicts, to organizing visitors for the sick Muslims in facilities, the Majlis has performed an array of services. We invite all







Muslims to sincerely work in whatever capacity they can, with their respective talent, expertise, and/or interest.

In accordance with the *sunnah* of naked-eye sighting of the *hilaal* (or a lunar month expiring due to having 30 days) and the *fard kifaayah* (communal obligation) of keeping track of time, *as per the Majlis' moon sighting committee, sunset April 9, 2024, marked the first day of the Islamic lunar month of Shawwaal 1445.*



AVOIDING UNNECESSARY VIOLENCE: RECITING THE QUR'AAN¹

Violence is part of the human experience on earth. Whether familial, community, regional, or violence on the international stage. It's a fact that we'll experience it first hand, or know someone who as, if we live long enough. This life has toil, confusion, violence, hatred, and more. But at the same time, love, respect, honor, and decency. Because violence is part of our experience doesn't mean we should embrace it or give in to it. It just means that there's a stark difference between this life (*dunyaa*) and the afterlife (*aakhirah*), whereas with the next life is littered with comfort. As Muslims, we are taught to want the best of both experiences, so there's not an either or. Moreover, we must believe that we need the former in order to get to the latter. There's no other way around it.

All the external and violent phenomena we see from humans are the results of internal disorder. In other words, whatever is going on inside of us

usually shows. Be it hatred, jealousy, envy, negative thoughts, etc. In essence, the diseases of the heart are at the root of many of our problems as humans and they sometimes manifest themselves in violent ways.

So how can reciting the Qur'aan make an impact with regards to violence in our communities? First, we have to accept that the Qur'aan is from Allah (swt), and that he would never leave us without guidance. This guidance is made available in the Qur'aan and life of Prophet Muhammad (saws).

Secondly, we have to read the Qur'aan attempting to be guided, while avoiding any legal judgments, unless we have the requisite knowledge to do such. And we need to read it often, not just during Ramadhaan. Thirdly, we need to practice *tadabbur* or reflecting deeply over what we've read. Lastly, and very difficult at times, we need to implement what we've read and pondered of the Qur'aan, to the best of our ability.

Part of our nature is to be pleased by certain sounds, as it is understood that our ears and hearts are susceptible to captivation. Hearing the Qur'aan and reflecting on its rhythm and meanings should move us towards being better humans.

Unnecessary violence always starts with individual decisions that are subsequently acted out. If we can do the previously mentioned regularly, while never letting go of the rope when we err, our families, communities, and countries can be less violent. It starts, or continues, with each one of us deciding to sincerely and consistently turn to Allah (swt). Therefore, the Qur'aan's role is significant. If we don't turn to the One who made us, knows us intimately, and has given us specific guidelines on how to comport ourselves. Then who and/or what's leading us?

EMAIL SCAMS

The electronic age has its advantages. Expectedly, there are some concerns though. Cybersecurity awareness is now a staple for most large and medium size companies, and virtually every government.

In 2022, 75% of organizations experienced types of cyber attacks.² With regards to phishing (a type of email cyber attack), Microsoft, Yahoo, and Google were the most targeted in the same year.³ Therefore, everyone is dealing with this concern. Recently, actors have tried to use the Majlis and its volunteers. One real example should suffice, the actors sent an email to someone within the Majlis requesting money for something apparently beneficial. Interestingly, the email address attempted to be very similar to some of our enterprise email accounts. And further, they posed as the President of the Majlis, with his identical real name and title. To be clear, this wasn't a hack, which is when bad actors gain access to an email

account (in this instance). But there were multiple scams attempting to gain assets.

Be judicious opening and responding to emails. The Majlis' email addresses are posted in this newsletter and website, for people to verify the sender. And if someone is asking you specifically for money, saying they're the Majlis, it's more than likely a scam. Why? If we ask the general public for money via emails, it would be a campaign, with all the particulars. Never just a random asking of money for gift cards, sadaqah, etc., by an official within the Majlis.
